Lynn had shoulder surgery and had her arm in a sling and could not steer to drive. Meanwhile, Charlene was in a cast on her one foot and could drive but could not walk more than a couple of steps. Together, they devised a plan to deliver and hang posters to promote our June 25th Trail Ride fundraiser. Charlene drove to various locations and Lynn would jump out and run the posters to their destinations. There was some chuckling as Lynn recounted the story, which of course, made us all laugh. However, I later reflected on the story and realized what awesome, generous and loving volunteers we have and I thank God for each and every one!

It's that time of year when the children begin to come to the ranch and we pair up mentors with kids in need. I recently had a conversation with a male mentor that made me smile inside because it became apparent that God was truly at the ranch at that moment. The children that come to our ranch have a variety of adversities and matching them up with the appropriate mentor can be difficult but is so important. I read the applicant's information to the mentor indicating that the child was dealing with anxiety, ADHD and personality issues that made him a frequent victim of bullying as well as making friendships difficult. Half way through the description, the mentor said matter-of-factly,

"Sounds like I'm going to be mentoring myself (when he was a child.)" I smiled and said, "Isn't that amazing how God works?"

We have volunteers ranging from teens to eighties. But I must admit that the age does not always equal the work produced. Take Bill Stroup, for example. Bill is a fellow member of our church, Family Bible Church. He just showed up one day when the sun was blazing hot. He brought tools and his weed whacker. This man weed whacked around our very large fence lines, he's mowed grass with a push mower, he has helped us stack hay bales and brush hogged our fields. And that was just two days that he was at RYYR! I believe this man to be, as his daughter-in-law has said, "A beast!" This is the second time in my life that have seen someone over 70 that can work circles around others that are younger than them. And again I say....Amazing Help.

Hahahahahaha....love ya BW! But on a more serious note, BW suffered a heart attack recently and we would truly appreciate your prayers for his recovery. We truly miss him.
