Additionally, last year, Matt & I sold our home of 20 years and moved to the home that abuts the farm. Painting, decluttering, cleaning, packing, moving and unpacking made 2018 a very busy and exhausting year for us. Please forgive me for not sharing the amazing things God has done at RYYR.

Ready Yourselves Youth Ranch is growing because the need is great. With that growth, the days fill up quickly with care for kids and horses. This is why we are so happy to announce that RYYR has hired Rebecca Shaw to help facilitate our growth.

At the very young age of 16, Rebecca knew what she wanted to do but wasn't sure what God had planned. Her love for the Lord and horses brought her through her childhood adversities with a joy and purpose. Her passion was to use God's awesome creation, the horse, in a way that opens the door to the love of Jesus Christ, thus redeeming lives that were once broken and hopeless. Rebecca received a Bachelor's degree in education from Geneva College. She also has owned her own horses as well as had many years of volunteering as well as employment with various therapeutic riding facilities. She has spent the past 10+ years studying horse training, riding, behavior and has also received her certification with the Professional Association of Therapeutic Horsemanship (PATH). Becca was a teacher in Mexico for two years at an orphanage with children who had experienced trauma. This experience was the catalyst for her desire to help hurting children. However, this desire would have to take a backseat for a few years as Rebecca came home to care for her mother who had become ill. And as God would orchestrate it, around the same time her Mom's health began to improve, Becca heard about RYYR through a friend. In the fall of 2017she quickly acclimated at the ranch and it seemed as if she had been there for years. Because of the craziness of 2018 for me, | could not handle all | had to do so Rebecca stepped up and "took the reins" and became our mentoring Program Coordinator.

When she is not consumed by ranch activities, Rebecca loves to spend time outdoors hiking, biking, rock climbing and kayaking.

Remi was rescued earlier this year in late winter. If you had seen her then, you would have thought that she didn't look too bad. Well, that was because she had lots of fluffy hair to compensate for her malnourished condition. We quickly discovered that she had been left out in fields along with another horse for the past 8 years, unhandled by humans. Her pasture mate had also died two years prior. And after 8 years, for whatever reason, she was unable to get access to another field of grass or hay. A neighbor contacted RYYR and we were able to corral her in a small area and trailer load her. Since coming to the ranch, we have confirmed that she is blind in her left eye and potentially has some vision loss in her right eye as well. It has been a huge adjustment for her to live in a barn and be led from her stall to pastures. In addition, she went from a relatively quiet solemn life to a noisy, active barn. Remi is a sweet horse and now in good health, she's had her feet trimmed, vaccinations and teeth done. Unfortunately, she is not a ridable horse and would be better suited in a single owner, quiet home with lots of pasture turn out and a run in. She would need a pasture mate as she has severe anxiety when separated from other horses. IS ANYTHING TOO DIFFICULT FOR GOD?

Your life changes in the blink of an eye. Most of you have experienced this and know it is not always for the better. This is one of those stories. In 2018, a beautiful and very polite teenage girl (we'll call her MK) came to RYYR to participate in our mentoring program. MK had witnessed two people die during a horrific car accident. The trauma had left her with nightmares and daily melt downs. MK just wanted to return to her life, finish high school and graduate but it all seemed too difficult. MK was deathly afraid of horses but on her first day at the ranch, she came eye to eye with her fears. While we were doing general introductions, I had one of our other mentors retrieve Pansie from the arena, and bring her around the back of the barn office so MK would not see her coming. As MK was talking, I could see her eyes narrow when she first felt Pansie breathing over her shoulder and then her eyes widened when she realized it was a horse. When she turned around to face our large draft horse, everything she felt melted away, leaving only momentary fear. And then Pansie lowered her head to get a little scratch. Little did MK know it, but in less than a month, her meltdowns and nightmares would stop. MK finished her program six weeks later and has since graduated from high school, able to resume the life she enjoyed. God is the healer. This ranch and it's volunteers are all just his tools.
